- WHEREAS, the City of Seattle draws great strength from a diversity of cultures, heritages, and traditions; and
- WHEREAS, Scandinavian immigrants helped settle the City of Seattle, and over 10% of Seattleites are of Scandinavian heritage; and
- WHEREAS, Icelandic-born Leif Erikson was the first recorded European to set foot on North American shores: and
- WHEREAS, a statue of Leif Erikson, originally unveiled at the Seattle World's Fair in 1962, has been refurbished and is ready to stand on the Seattle shoreline for another 45 years; replicas of Seattle's statue have been given to Norway and Greenland; and
- WHEREAS, the Leif Erikson International Foundation, working with the Port of Seattle, has created a public plaza with rune stones bearing the names of over 800 immigrants from Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway, and Sweden; and
- WHEREAS, On October 7, 2007, Scandinavian Americans and their families will join together to witness the unveiling of the refurbished statue and to celebrate the creation of Leif Erikson Plaza;
